Ana Gimeno-Sanz, PhD in English Philology, has been a member of the teaching and research staff at the Department of Applied Linguistics, Universidad Politécnica de Valencia (UPV), Spain, since 1985 and is Senior Lecturer in English Language.

She has published numerous research papers on language learning and teaching, more specifically in the fields of English for Specific Purposes (ESP) and Computer Assisted Language Learning (CALL).

She has published *CALL Software Design and Implementation: the template approach* (Valencia: SP-UPV, 2002), and is co-author of four textbooks for learners of English for engineering purposes.

Dr Gimeno is Head of UPV's CAMILLE Research Group, which is devoted to research in CALL.

She has been the Project Manager of several funded multimedia CALL research and development projects which have led to the publication of a number of language courses on CD-ROM: *Español Interactivo* and *Español en marcha* (Barcelona: Difusión, 1998); *Valencià Interactiu* (Valencia: Bromera, 2000), *City Talk* (London: Libra Multimedia, 2000), *¡Bienvenido a bordo!* (London: Unicorn, 2002), *Vida Urbana* (Valencia: SP-UPV, 2004), *Airline Talk* (Valencia: SP-UPV, 2005).

In addition to having participated in a number of EU funded projects –*MultiConcord*, *Airline Talk*, *City Talk*, *ICT4LT*, *Hello Net*, *Welcome*, etc.–, she is Project Manager of *Proyecto InGenio*, funded by UPV, and has created an on-line dedicated CALL authoring tool and content manager to enable the publication of interactive courseware for foreign language learning on the web. With this tool she has published *Intermediate Online English*, a course which is delivered through the *InGenio* learning environment and which is widely used by learners from around the world.

Ana Gimeno was co-ordinator of the LINGUA-funded *CALL@C&S* Project (2004-2007), which aimed to design and deliver online A1 & A2 level courses for learners of Czech and Slovak.

She is currently President of the European Association for Computer Assisted Language Learning (EUROCALL).
